


#### Squirrel Class

Callum loves to watch the horses. Lots of children are painting stones and laying them here to show hope. Callum made a salt dough star which he painted yellow.






Malachy's been busy and also helped his mum with the shopping at the supermarket this week.

Mrs West is growing seedlings on her allotment.








Mr Barnes, our site manager, skilfully upcycled a 'hanging basket man' made out of an old bunk bed.




Ms Brown and Georgie are becoming very fit with some calming yoga.

Curtis is pictured here enjoying his celebration which even included a special birthday throne to sit on!






Mrs Desouky sent a happy birthday message from mouse class to Beatriz.
